February Webinar

We are launching our Webinar series with Danielle Poirier, the creator of the *Magnificent 16* who will present “**Projections and how to reel them in**”. Using psychological type, personal stories and *The Magnificent 16*, this session will introduce ways to learn and teach about projections and how to reel them back in, for healthier relationships and a healthier you.

What you learn:

- How to identify projections
- An understanding of the purpose they serve in our psyche
- An appreciation of the harm they cause and the good they bring
- Specific ways to reel them back in
- A powerful exercise that helps us integrate the message behind the projections.

Best known for *The Magnificent 16*, a multimedia illustration of the sixteen personality types and winner of the 2009 APTi Innovation Award, Danielle is a trainer and consultant responsible for qualifying professionals in the use of the MBTI and training trainers in its applications since the late 80’s. Danielle is based in Montreal, Canada.
